### **Head Lice—a constant problem**

In most cases, itching is the main symptom for head-lice. It's not always easy to see them so detection combing is the best way of finding head lice. This involves using a special fine-toothed head lice comb (with tooth spacing of less than 0.3mm to trap the smallest lice) to comb through the hair. It works better on wet hair but can be used on dry hair. Detection combs can be bought at any chemist. Although it is difficult to prevent a head lice infestation, regular detection combing - for example, on a weekly basis—is the best way to find new lice quickly. Medicated lotions and sprays do not prevent head lice infestations and should only be used if a live louse has been found on yours or your child's head.

It's so good to see the children looking smart in their school uniform. May we please just remind you to check your child is wearing the correct coloured socks/tights and shoes. Hair must be neatly tied back and only plain maroon or black hair bands should be worn.

Please could you ensure your child's PE kit is brought into school on a Monday and remains here all week. KS2 children may wear trainers for outside PE but all dance and gym activities are done in bare feet.
