Rainforests.

Our topic this term is Rainforests. Please complete at least 4 items on the grid to do in your homework books before Easter. Remember that daily reading, spelling and maths activities take priority.

<p>Draw and label a rainforest animal. Write about what it eats and where it lives. Which rainforest does it live in? What layer of the rainforest does it live in? Can you include some fascinating facts?</p>	<p>Make a poster about your own new year's resolutions. Write out the things you want to get better at and add illustrations. Think about what you are going to do to make your lifestyle even healthier.</p>	<p>Write your own rainforest 'What Am I?' animal riddle. Remember the clues start from hardest to easiest with each clue on a new line.</p>	<p>Make a 'Save the Rainforest' poster on A4 paper. List the reasons why people should stop cutting down trees in the rainforest.</p>
<p>Once we have learned more about rainforests in class, create your own rainforest collage or painting. Try to feature all the rainforest layers including the forest floor, canopy and emergent layer. Add some animals to your picture.</p>	<p>Write a maths word problem featuring rainforest animals for a friend to solve - for example: Five sloths were sitting in a tree when two climbed down slowly to get some food. How many were left?</p>	<p>Find out more about a country that has a rainforest in it. How many people live in that country? What animals can be found there? What food grows there? What sport is played there? Add any other interesting facts you can about it.</p>	<p>Imagine you are a rainforest explorer. Write about your visit to a rainforest. Describe what you can see, hear, smell and feel as you look around and explore.</p>
