Behaviour Policy Review

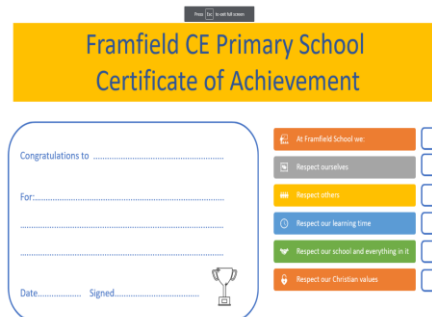
You will be aware that we have been reviewing our School's 'Behaviour and Relationships Policy.' We have consulted carefully with all members of our community, including pupils, parents, governors and staff and the changes to our policy reflect our knowledge of what works for children and the views of our stakeholders. Parents were very clear when consulted, that they wanted to support their children and the school in maintaining good standards of behaviour in the school. They were clear that they wanted information about their child's behaviour and achievements to allow them to support their child effectively.

The main changes to the policy can be summarised as follows:

- We have written the 5Rs as a clear code of conduct for pupils to be guided by.
- There is greater continuity of rewards and sanctions across the whole school.
- While rewards remain an important way in which we encourage good behaviour, sanctions are now more consistent and transparent.
- Parents will be given more information about when their child behaves particularly well or struggles to uphold the 5Rs through phone calls or by email.

What does the Governing Body do?

In the parent survey that we ran earlier in the year, we had a few more people than usual say they didn't know what the Governing Body did. To rectify this what follows is a very brief overview, which I hope you will find helpful.

The primary purpose of any Governing Body is to help school improvement.

It does this by being a 'critical and challenging friend' by:

- (a) Supporting the Headteachers in determining the strategy and direction of the school - ensuring there is clarity of vision and ethos;
- (b) Implementing statutory requirements such Safeguarding;
- (c) Monitoring and evaluating pupil progress and holding the Headteachers to account for the educational performance of each and every child. This includes performance management of the Headteachers;
- (d) Overseeing the financial performance of the School by making sure it's money is well spent.

In addition, as we are a voluntary aided Church of England Federation the Governing Body is responsible for admissions and is the employer of all members of staff.
