Develop maths problems using imperial measures or 'old money' and solve them.	Write a poem about SMUGGLING. It could be a narrative or an acrostic.	Design and create a new game based around smuggling.
Create a Victorian style landscape picture of smugglers on the coast. Choose which media you use - paint, water colours or collage.	Write a letter applying for a job as a smuggler. What skills would you need? Remember that there were different types of smuggler so pick your position carefully!	Make a Top Trumps game about famous smuggling gangs and the items that they smuggled.	Make a model of a ship that might have transported smuggled goods.	Research the costume of a smuggler. Draw him. Can you create a new disguise for him?
Visit a local library. What can you find out about smuggling? (Some churches have smugglers graves, maybe you could find out where these are!)	Find a recipe from the 1700s. Have a go at making it- write a review or instructions with pictures of your food items.	Draw and create a labelled diagram of a typical smuggler's galleon.
