Dear Parents/Carers,

I wanted to start this newsletter by explaining a little more about the 'ray of the sunshine' that is our Friday Assembly. It's a slightly extended assembly that provides a real dose of positivity at the end of the week. Class teachers nominate a child per year group to receive one of our coveted 5Rs Certificate. Based on the school's 5Rs (Respect ourselves, Respect others, Respect our learning time, Respect our school and Respect our Christian Values) these certificates are personalised and each child who earns a certificate is given a clap, a badge and then is able to sit on a nice comfy chair for the rest of assembly. We call these 'our best seats in the house!'. During this action packed assembly we present certificates for Mathletics, TT RockStars, and we celebrate successes on Spelling Shed. A lovely surprise comes next: If any child has achieved anything out of school, we call them to the front and share their success with the rest of school. Recently this has been trampolining awards, swimming badges and a seriously impressive motocross trophy. Next up, the house captains take over and share the school totals for house points. We give house points out for good work and good effort with learning. Ash House were the winners this week, but what was exciting was that each house scored over 100 house points for the week. A Framfield first! We end assembly with a hymn, (Colours of Day is our current favourite) and then a house captain will read a prayer from our prayer journal. The prayer journal is available in the James Room for any child to write in. Putting our worries into God's hands or thanking God for the things we have to be fortunate about are common themes.

Strike Action

I have no doubt you will be aware that one of the teaching unions, The NEU have declared strike action to be held during this term. The first day of action is scheduled to be Wednesday 1st February. It may be that members of staff choose to strike at Framfield School. This is a difficult decision for colleagues to make and if a teacher takes the decision to strike it is essentially to raise the profile of the chronic underfunding of schools at the present time. Teacher pay is one symptom of this underfunding, but there are many others. Strained school budgets and the challenges of recruitment are all linked to underfunding.

At Framfield, we will support colleagues who are members of the NEU and chose to strike on this issue. However on the occasion of 1st February, school will remain **open** for all pupils and we are confident any absences can be covered without risk to Health and Safety or the children's education. **Please bring your children to school as normal on Wednesday**.

School Lunch Increase

We have been notified via East Sussex County Council that Chartwells, providers of our School lunches, will be increasing their meal prices from Monday 30th January 2023 to £2.60 daily. This price will be protected from any rise until 01st September 2023. Please remember pupils in Peacocks and Kingfishers are entitled to free school meals via the Universal Infant Free School Meal entitlement.

Our links with Uckfield College are really important to us and aids the transition between year 6 at Framfield and potential year 7 at Uckfield College.


Open the Book Assembly
