September 2023 School Finishing Time

In order to bring Framfield School closer in line with the Government recommendation of 32 1/2 school hours a week we are proposing a finish time of 3:15pm each day from September 2023. This will provide us with an extra 75 minutes learning time a week, something that will benefit all children's learning. This will also bring Framfield more in line with other local schools and have consistency of teaching hours across our Federation.

Naturally, we are currently exploring the impact this will have on wrap around care and school clubs such as the Federation football club. So to clarify, the plan for each day from September is for the gate to be opened at 8:45am at which time early bird maths will be ready in classrooms. The gate will be locked at 8:55am by when every child is expected to be in school. At the end of the day, the gate will be opened at 3:10pm for parents to come onto the playground, with children being dismissed from class at 3:15pm.

Summer Reading Challenge 2023



Ready, Set Read!

Starts 8 July 2023 Ends 9 September 2023

The Summer Reading Challenge is a national scheme produced by the Reading Agency and delivered by public libraries that encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays – and to enjoy anything they like to read! Children aged 4-11 are invited to take part and collect rewards for their reading, giving them a positive experience of reading for pleasure.

It's **FREE** to take part, and last year 75% of children taking part nationally improved their reading skills over the holidays.¹

Sign your child up at <u>www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src</u> If you don't have a smartphone, computer or tablet, you can sign up using a computer in the library. You can ask a one of our volunteers or a member of staff for help if you need it.

The Challenge will begin in <u>East Sussex libraries</u> on Saturday 8th July and end on Saturday 9th September.

The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from our <u>ebook</u> <u>library</u>. For children under 4 we have the Pre-school Challenge, where you can collect stickers for each book shared and a special medal sticker at the end.

Children signing up for the Challenge get a character sticker and a Reader Record. Children will be able to collect a prize for each of the six books they have read. When they finish the Challenge they will get a certificate which they can receive in school or at the library. The Challenge is for all children, whatever their reading ability. Children who are not reading independently can share their books with a family member or friend, or they might prefer to listen to audio books.

To take part in Read, Set Read! children need to have their own library card and PIN. It is easy and free to become a member of the library. Take something with your name, address and signature to the library and you can join the whole family, or you can join online and have your cards posted to you. You can <u>reset your child's PIN online</u> if you can't remember it, or ask in the library for a new one. You will need the PIN to sign up to the Challenge.
