## Attendance and Punctuality

Improving punctuality and attendance is an area of improvement for both of the federated schools and a key area of interest by both the local council and inspectors. We know that it cannot be helped if a child has a temperature and therefore is absent but we seem to have much lower percentages for the term than this time last year. There is an obvious correlation between attendance and progress for all children. Please support us and your children by keeping them in school when feasibly possible.

We have received quite a few requests for 'granted leave' which do not match the Church of England's criteria: 1 day for weddings, funerals or Christenings. Arriving promptly (ideally 08:45) means that the children can settle in and undertake their early morning tasks. Those who are late then miss out on these learning opportunities and often find it hard to settle into the day.

Thank you for your support with this matter.
