Dear Parents / Carers,

Since the last newsletter we have welcomed two trainees teachers from Uckfield College thus further developing links between the schools and offering primary experience to secondary colleagues. It was lovely to hear such glowing feedback about how they found their 'Framfield Experience'. It has been great to make use of the local partnership to upskill our subject leaders who attended an afternoon with other local subject leaders.

We had more sporting events and success...read on to find out more. Mrs Kent's superb organisation and passion coupled with support from adults like Miss Keenan enables so many children to get to represent the school and try out playing sports competitively- this is music to my ears! The Year 1 and 2 children took part in the 'Multi-Skills' event and the Year 5 and 6 children took part in the local cross-country event.

We have so many amazing events taking place in the school and school community. Please diarise the key dates listed in the newsletters and website.

Please can I remind parents that your child must have a P.E kit in school at all times. If your child has participated in a sporting club or event the night before, we still require a P.E kit in school. Over the last 2 weeks we have had 20% of pupils borrowing school P.E kit from the school office. This takes valuable time away from members of staff having to rectify this issue.

Attendance

We have someone from the local authority coming in next week for an attendance review meeting, all schools have these meetings. Attendance is a key indicator of children's future success and despite reminders, the attendance has dropped considerably over the last few weeks. The average % figure that schools are expected to meet is 95%.

We have 45 pupils already under 95%. Anyone whose attendance % is under 90% is deemed as having 'persistent absence'; we have 25 pupils under 90%! Very soon, letters will be sent home to all families updating you on your child's attendance. 90% means 1 day missed every two week. Thank you for your support with this matter. We are empathetic to those whose children have experienced temperatures (and must be off) but children can come into school having taken Calpol.

Sofia and Elizabeth represented Framfield in the Year 5 girls' event and Jamie, Harry P, Vanya and Luca represented Framfield in the Year 5 boys' event. In each race 100 children competed from schools across the North Wealden Area.

Sofia and Jamie made it into the third round and will continue to represent Framfield as part of the North Wealden Warriors at the Sussex School Games on 27th March 2024 at Crawley Rugby Club. We wish them well in the next stage.

Parents can assist children who cannot complete the survey themselves (children under 5 and children with Special Educational Needs). This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice.
