


Computing: small plastic bottles and decorative materials such as foil, plastic packaging, paper of different colours, sequins, tissue paper, etc.



















Science: any old animal toys your children do not use at home. Any brown shades of play doh.

Home Learning

Reading	<p>Please read with your child <u>at least three times a week</u>, even if it is just for 5 minutes. When reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by <u>recording this on Boom Reader. If you need a reminder of your Boom Reader Log in then ask Miss Hodge.</u></p> <p>During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2. Kingfishers are encouraged to change their books regularly, please can you help remind your child when their books need changing.</p>
Phonics	<p>Each week the Weekly Phonics Overview will be sent home to supplement the weeks learning with any practice they may do.</p>
Spelling Year 2	<p>We will not be setting weekly Spellings but HFWs will be sent home that we have learnt that week for your children to practice.</p>
Maths Year 2	<p>For Maths homework please work through the weekly Maths activities on the set work in your child's CPG book. You can work through these at a pace that works for your child.</p>

Snacks:

Just a quick reminder that the school does provide a healthy snack each day for the children. However, if you would prefer to send your child in with their own snack, please ensure it is **one healthy snack only** (such as fruit or vegetables).
