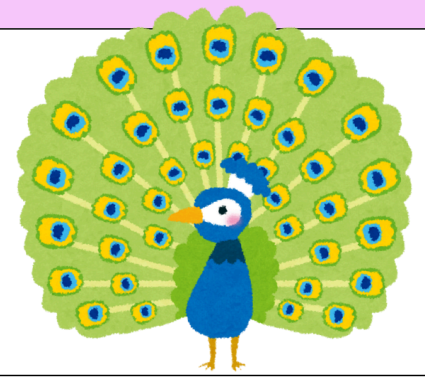


# PEACOCKS
